Established in 1885, the University of Arizona is the state's flagship, land grant institution. The U of A ranks among America's top institutions, focusing on student access and success while driving a \$1 billion research enterprise and engaging communities throughout the state and worldwide. As a leading Research 1 institution and member of the Association

of American Universities, the U of A advances the frontiers of interdisciplinary scholarship and entrepreneurial partnerships. With two accredited medical schools, designation as a Hispanic-Serving Institution by the U.S. Dept. of Education, recognition as a premier university for service members, and distinctive degree programs ranging from management information systems to planetary sciences, dance, photography, and public and applied humanities, the U of A offers the world to its students while engaging and uplifting Arizona.

CEREMONIAL SYMBOLS

The President's Medallion



The University of Arizona President's Medallion is worn as part of the President's regalia on all formal ceremonial occasions. Crafted from gold, it depicts the official University of Arizona Seal, a trademark of the Office of the President since 1915. The back of the medallion reads: "The President's Medallion: Presented to the Office of the President by the University of

Arizona Foundation." The medallion has been a long-standing tradition passed along to each president at the time of their installation.



The Ceremonial Mace

The University of Arizona Mace, carried by the Chair of the Faculty, Dr. Leila Hudson, reflects the unique character, mission and values of the university while signifying its dignity and authority. This three-part staff features a crown of sterling silver surrounding the seal of the university accented with 22K gold. Underlying the

crown are 24 acrylic strips in the school colors of red and blue, adding a jewel-like sparkle. The main shaft is made of local mesquite with a sterling silver band inscribed with 'The University of Arizona', also accented with 22K gold. The tailpiece repeats the motif of the crown and surrounds a medallion with the mark of the Arizona Wildcat. This symbolic piece was crafted for the university by College of Fine Arts Professor Emeritus Michael Croft.



Academic Regalia

The rich tapestry of gowns, caps and hoods on display at a presidential installation comes from a tradition of academic dress stemming from the 16th century.

U.S. doctoral robes, generally black with black velvet sleeve chevrons, may also reflect the colors of the degree-granting institution. With faculty and delegates in

the procession representing universities from around the world, gowns may be any number of colors and worn open or closed. Academic hoods have a complex code, where the silky lining reflects the degree-granting institution's colors and pattern, and the edging color represents the discipline – from engineering orange and science gold to the salmon pink of public health. The University of Arizona official ceremonial gown worn by the president is red with navy yoke and facing embroidered with the university's seal, and carries four chevrons on each sleeve.



Suresh V. GarimellaPresident, University of Arizona
University Distinguished Professor

Suresh Garimella serves as the 23rd president of the University of Arizona and University Distinguished Professor in the Department of Mechanical and Aerospace Engineering, positions he assumed on October 1, 2024. He was unanimously appointed by the Arizona Board of Regents following a robust national search. On selecting Garimella to lead the university, Board Chair Cecilia Mata praised his collaborative leadership, experience, and vision, calling him a "tireless champion for students" who is well suited to lead the university into a bright future.

Previously, he was president of the University of Vermont (UVM) from 2019 to 2024. Under his leadership, the university underscored its reputation as a premier flagship research university dedicated to providing a world-class student experience and committed to fulfilling its land-grant mission, a focus he brings to the U of A as well.

Throughout his career, Garimella has emphasized the importance of access and affordability for students, and he has worked to promote excellence in the student learning experience. A professor of mechanical engineering, he is both a highly cited scholar and researcher and a passionate educator, mentoring more than 65 undergraduate students who worked in his lab, as well as over 90 graduate students and 50 post-doctoral scholars, 30 of whom hold prestigious faculty positions around the world.

During his tenure as UVM's president, he led an annual undergraduate seminar class devoted to engaging students in civil discourse on multifaceted contemporary issues.

As a researcher, Garimella has made seminal contributions to the field of electronics thermal management and energy efficiency at micro and nano scales, and in sustainable energy systems technology and policy. He is co-author of over 625 refereed publications and 16 issued patents, and he has been recognized as an elected Member of the National Academy of Engineering and Fellow of the National Academy of Inventors, the American Association for the Advancement of Science and the American Society of Mechanical Engineers.

Garimella also has made important contributions in national and international policy matters. He served as a member of the National Science Board, which oversees the National Science Foundation and acts as an independent body of advisers to both the President and Congress on policy matters related to science and engineering. He also chairs the research advisory board of Sandia National Laboratories, is a member of the board of directors at Modine and the executive committee for the Council on Competitiveness, and previously served as a Jefferson Science Fellow at the U.S. Department of State and as Senior Fellow for Energy and Climate Partnership of the Americas.

Prior to his time leading the University of Vermont, President Garimella served at Purdue University as the Goodson Distinguished Professor of Mechanical Engineering and Executive Vice President for Research and Partnerships. Under his leadership of Purdue's \$660 million research enterprise, the university achieved five consecutive record years in sponsored funding and seeded approximately 50 startups annually. He developed strategic and comprehensive partnerships with major corporations, NGOs, and national governments in Colombia, India, and the Middle East, conceived and implemented ambitious campus-wide initiatives in life sciences and integrative data science, and oversaw Purdue's Discovery Park, a unique set of facilities and institutes where the convergence of disciplines helped solve global challenges related to health and life sciences, sustainability, food, energy, and defense and security.

His educational background includes a PhD from the University of California, Berkeley, an MS from The Ohio State University, and a bachelor's degree from the Indian Institute of Technology, Madras.

GUEST SPEAKERS



Heather Wilson

President, University of Texas at El Paso Former Secretary of the U.S. Air Force Former Member of the U.S. Congress representing New Mexico

Dr. Heather Wilson became the 11th President of The University of Texas at El Paso in 2019 after serving as Secretary of the United States Air Force. She is the former

president of the South Dakota School of Mines & Technology, and she represented New Mexico in the United States Congress for 10 years.

Active in community and national affairs, she is a member of the National Science Board, which oversees the National Science Foundation, and serves as a board member of the Texas Space Commission. She was the inaugural Chair of the Alliance of Hispanic Serving Research Universities, and is a member of the board of directors of Lockheed Martin Corporation.

Dr. Wilson is the granddaughter of immigrants and was the first person in her family to go to college. She graduated from the U.S. Air Force Academy in the third class to admit women and earned her master's and doctoral degrees from Oxford University in England as a Rhodes Scholar.

Dr. Wilson is an instrument rated private pilot. She and her husband, Jay Hone, have two adult children and two granddaughters.



Wolfgang Mieder

University Distinguished Professor Emeritus of German and Folklore University of Vermont

Wolfgang Mieder has taught at the University of Vermont for fifty years and was the long-time chairperson of the Department of German and Russian. Among his honors are international prizes in folkloristics and

fairy tale studies, the lifetime achievement award of the American Folklore Society, three honorary doctorates from universities here and in Europe, and most recently the "Bundesverdienstkreuz" (Order of Merit of the

Federal Republic of Germany). The author of numerous English and German books on fairy tales, legends and folk songs, he is recognized internationally for his expertise in paremiology (proverb studies). Among his books are: "Making a Way Out of No Way": Martin Luther King's Sermonic Proverbial Rhetoric (2010); "Behold the Proverbs of a People: Proverbial Wisdom in Culture, Literature, and Politics" (2014); "Right Makes Might": Proverbs and the American Worldview (2019); and "A Rising Tide Lifts All the Boats: The Proverbial Rhetoric of John F. Kennedy" (2023).



Pablo Navas Sanz de Santamaría Executive Director Aspen Institute Colombia

Born in Bogotá, Pablo Navas is an Industrial Engineer from Cornell University and has a MBA from the Universidad de los Andes. In his professional career he has served as Vice Chancellor of Colegio San Carlos, Founding

Member of Colegio Los Nogales and of the Alianza Educativa Association. Additionally, he has been president of Global Education Group Colombia, Director of the Commercial Office of Proexport in New York and Member of the Superior Council of the Universidad de los Andes from 1983 to 2011, the year in which he assumed the rectory of the institution until 2019.

Presently, he is member of various boards of directors, including Universidad de los Andes, Fundación Mario Santodomingo, Corporación Financiera Colombiana, Innova Schools and Visum Capital. He is the author of the books: "The Journey of Frederic Edwin Church through Colombia and Ecuador," "Colombia en Le Tour du Monde," and "Alberto Magno en los Andes."
